

ANNECY-LE GRAND-BORNAND: the biathlon has found its home in France...

In the early 2000s, **French biathlon had won international recognition**, but still lacked a major venue. Since the Winter Olympic Games in Albertville in 1992, no major international competition had been held in France, except for the Junior World Cup in 2004 in Haute-Maurienne and the European Championship in 1995 in Le Grand-Bornand.

Métabief, Bessans, Autrans, Chamonix and Le Grand-Bornand bid to host a World Cup. After much deliberation, **the French Ski Federation (FFS) selected Le Grand-Bornand** on November 24th 2007, approving the assets of a site that was part of Annecy's bid to host the Winter Olympics in 2018.

The IBU approved the French bid and the French Ski Federation awarded the **six** legs of the World Cup to Annecy-Le Grand-Bornand to host in December 2013, 2017, 2019, 2021, 2022 and 2024.

This is the next chapter of the story... ...to be continued in 2026, 2028, with the perspective of the Olympic and Paralympic Games French Alps 2030.



INTERNATIONAL SYLVIE BECAERT STADIUM: WELCOME TO THE «MONACO OF THE BIATHLON»!

When it comes to Le Grand-Bornand's international biathlor stadium, the name says it all. It's named after **Sylvie Becaert**, a homegrown champion in the 2000s and figurehead for resort athletes. Her name was the natural choice for the World Cup stadium that made its debut in March 2011 for the IBU Cup finals.

The stadium is the only site in France to have the IBU licence A and meet international standards with thirty targets on its shooting range, a penalty loop, open and compact cross-country ski pistes, a start and finish area and spectator areas. Aside from its technical features, the Sylvie Becaert stadium is unique on the world circuit for its pop-up concept and village location, making it to the biathlon what Monaco is to motor racing. It melts into the majestic Aravis landscape, is convenient for spectators and designed to be as eco-friendly as possible.





LE GRAND BORNAND

We've come so far since the early 2000s when we first bid for the French leg of the Biathlon World Cup - «our» World Cup - to become an integral part of the world circuit over time. So many people and so much excitement fills the air in Le Grand-Bornand as supporters come together for a week. I never got the chance to experience the thrill of competing on home turf, so it makes me very proud to see French teams excel in front of a home crowd! I have one thing left to say to our beloved athletes, audiences, partners and volunteers without whom none of this would be possible: welcome to Le Grand-Bornand and let's get the great French biathlon festivities underway!

All parts of success





The biathlon has military roots and was included in the Winter Olympics for the first time in 1960. The word derives from the Latin «bi» («two») and Greek «athlon» (combat, contest). The sport combining cross-country skiing and rifle shooting requires calm and dexterity...

The sprint is the shortest event with the smallest amount of shooting. The emphasis is on speed and performance on the skis. The athletes start one after the other, every 30 seconds. The final result of the race is important, since it decides on the starting order for the pursuit.



Distance: 10 km – 3 loops of 3.3 km with 2 shootings (prone/standing)

+ 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target



Distance: 7.5 km – 3 loops of 2.5 km with 2 shootings (prone/standing)

+ 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target



Unlike for the sprint, all the biathletes race together on the track. The starting order depends on the standing after the sprint. The pursuit is a very intense race with plenty of exciting developments. With the short distance and the four shootings, competitors can soon find themselves at the foot of the rankings, making this a mentally demanding event even for the most experienced athletes.



Distance: 12.5 km – 5 loops of 2.5 km with 4 shootings (prone/prone/standing/standing) + 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target



Distance: 10 km – 5 loops of 2 km with 4 shootings (prone/prone/standing/standing) + 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target





Mass start:

The mass start is quite similar to the pursuit, but without time intervals at the start. All the athletes set off at the same time. So this is also a tense, exciting race with only the first 25 competitors in the general World Cup standing and athletes with the top five performances in the current race taking part.



Men

Distance: 15 km – 5 loops of 3 km with 4 shootings (prone/prone/ standing/standing) + 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target



Women

Distance: 12.5 km – 5 loops of 2.5 km with 4 shootings (prone/ prone/standing/standing) + 1 loop of 150 m for a missed target



• NEW! FREE SHUTTLE BUSES AVAILABLE TO BOOK FROM ANNECY, LA ROCHE-SUR-FORON AND SAINT-PIERRE-EN-FAUCIGNY (booking required):

The Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region, SNCF TER railway network and Biathlon Committee have joined forces to bring you a simple, convenient and eco-friendly transport solution that drops you off right outside the biathlon stadium:

- From **Annecy/Bus station** (in front of the train station): Y62-Y63 buses.
- From La Roche-sur-Foron/Train station: special coach service.
 From Saint-Pierre-en-Faucigny/Train station: special coach

We highly recommend taking the bus or train to the stations (no special car parks).

Le Grand-Bornand arrivals: bus station stop (on the cemetery car park side), Route du Borne (map L7).

Le Grand-Bornand departures: on Route des Pochons (map M6). **Free shuttle buses** available to book for anyone with a biathlon ticket for the same day. Please show the driver your ticket when boarding.

Booking compulsory with card details: a deposit of 8€ per journey and per person is required when you book and debited in the event of a no-show. Free cancellation up to 48 hours in advance.

Are you planning to come for the day or stay for a few days? You need to book a ticket for every day.

• FREE SHUTTLE BUSES FROM THÔNES AND GLIÈRES VAL DE BORNE (NO NEED TO BOOK):

Departure from designated P&R car parks (free).

Le Grand-Bornand arrivals/departures: stop at the Mairie (Town Hall, Grand-Bornand Village centre, Route du Chinaillon map M8). The shuttle buses provide an express service (no stops on the way).

Shuttle bus timetable:



The roads are very busy at the end of the events, especially on Sunday, so we highly recommend you leave plenty of time to get back to the station.

HOW TO GET HERE

 A40 (Autoroute Blanche): exit junction 16 Bonneville, follow signs for Stations des Aravis for 12 miles, then Glières-Val-de-Borne.
 A41: exit junction Annecy Nord and follow signs for Thônes/ Stations des Aravis for 19 miles, then Thônes.

- Col de la Colombière mountain pass is closed.

Winter tyres or snow chains mandatory.

• CAR PARKS

Free parking for the day at the P&R car parks in Thônes or Glières-Val-de-Borne (please see «Free Shuttle Buses from Thônes and Glières Val de Borne» above).

Le Grand-Bornand: restricted parking for the day only available along Route de la Vallée du Bouchet starting at Clos du Pin campsite. At the end of the day's event, drivers won't be able to leave Le Grand-Bornand until spectators using public transport have left. Winter tyres or snow chains mandatory.

If you're staying in the resort, please park at your holiday home or apartment car park so you don't have to use your car during the 4-day event. Depending on your accommodation, you can go to the stadium on foot or by skibus (please see «Skibus in the resort» section).

> INTER-RESORT SKIBUS

If you're staying **in La Clusaz or Saint-Jean-de-Sixt** and want to visit Le Grand-Bornand, please leave your car where you're staying (payable or time-restricted parking in the village centres) and use the free buses.

Departures from La Clusaz bus station and the St-Jean de Sixt Centre/Boulangerie stop:



LE GRAND-BORNAND, integral to the history of French biathlon

Nordic skiing has always been part of Le Grand-Bornand's sporting legacy, as has the biathlon. Its legacy is fuelled by its athletes and expertise in hosting first class events. Here's a potted history of the milestones that have stood out in the sport... and resort.

Christophe Vassallo, today president of the technical committee of the IBU and national coordinator of biathlon within the French Ski Federation, participates there several times.

The IBU organised the **European Championships** for the first time and selected Le Grand-Bornand to host it. The sprint champion Raphaël Poirée won his first major international senior title here.

Sylvie Becaert is the world champion in sprintà Kanthy-Mansiysk and wins the Crystal Globe. The Bornandine will win during her career two Olympic medals and five world medals.

2007/2011•

The French Cross-Country Skiing Championships were the main event.

There wasn't a dry eye in the house when Raphaël Poirée and Florence Baverel hung up their rifles for the last time in 2007.

The French Ski Federation selected the Le Grand-Bornand site as part of the French bid to host a World Cup. The resort was chosen to host two legs in 2011 (which was cancelled) and 2013 as well as the IBU Cup final in 2011.

Le Grand-Bornand hosted the first stage of the Biathlon World Cup in France. The Military World Games took place in Annecy. Le Grand-Bornand hosted the cross-country skiing and biathlon events.

Le Grand-Bornand staged the third leg of the World **Cup** which stood out for **Martin Fourcade and Justine** Braisaz's success in the mass start.

The French team once again took centre stage with 4 podium finishes in 6 events for Quentin Fillon-Maillet (2), Emilien Jacquelin and Justine Braisaz who were cheered on by a record crowd.

The IBU confirmed the World Cup would be held in Annecy-Le Grand Bornand in 2022, 2024 and 2025

The French team had the perfect week in front of a record crowd with Emilien Jacquelin and Quentin Fillon-Maillet coming top in the mass start, Quentin Fillon-Maillet's success in the pursuit and Julia Simon (pursuit and mass start) and Anaïs Bescond's (sprint) podium finishes.

· 2022/2023

The Le Grand-Bornand leg came before a break in the sporting calendar and proved just how popular the event is. The ladies in the French team took centre stage that weekend, with three medals for Julia Simon (2) and

Anaïs Chevalier-Bouchet. Le Grand-Bornand's very own Sophie Chauveau earned her highest ranking to date with 4th place in the sprint. The following season saw her win the world relay champion and keep the legacy alive.









2024 saw Johannes and Tarjei Boe end their season on a high after winning the pursuit and mass start in Le Grand-Bornand.



Le Grand-Bornand land of champions, they are also the biathletes Benjamin Daviet, five-time champion Paralympic in cross-country skiing and biathlon, and 9 times champion of the world, and Damien Levet's selection for the French team.

The French leg of the Biathlon World Cup is returning to the Sylvie Becaert International Stadium in 2026 and 2028, before the Olympics and Paralympics come to the French Alps in 2030. The last stage to join the international circuit stands out for its unbelievable atmosphere. Let's find out more from Yannick Aujouannet, the man in charge.

Yannick, what is your role in the French leg of the **Biathlon World Cup?**

Yannick Aujouannet: « As general secretary, I'm in charge of steering and coordinating the Biathlon Committee with the help of all the event's stakeholders. We mainly work with councillors, resort directors, commission managers and institutional partners such as the French Ski Federation, IBU, Haute-Savoie Département and Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes Region. Our partnership with them enables us to host a World Cup to the standards and deadlines set by the IBU.

You often travel to visit other World Cup legs, especially in Europe...

Y. A.: Yes, it's very rewarding and informative visiting other sites and seeing how they're organised. The January and March Cups are the best for a trip because they happen after our event. During our visits, we chat with our counterparts and IBU members, discuss how we work and share our experiences so we can compare our methods and take our organisation forwards. The IBU actually encourages Biathlon



Committees to travel and promote communication between each other.

Le Grand-Bornand is fast becoming one of the most popular stages on the circuit, is that right?

Y. A.: The French leg is celebrating its 7th outing on the world circuit this year and is still the new kid on the block. That said, French spectators rose to the occasion to watch the best biathletes in the world battle it out at the first event in 2013. Another thing that fuels their enthusiasm is the French team's success. Plus the leg in December 2024 made the French World Cup the most popular, with over 63,000 tickets sold.

What do you think sets this French leg apart from the rest?

Y. A.: It's the combination of location, audience and athletes. The location, because the Sylvie Becaert Stadium is unique on the circuit, right in the village centre, very compact and open. It gets you up close to the biathletes. The audience, because French spectators are huge fans, and the athletes, because they love the atmosphere and interacting with spectators by the piste.

As a fan, what's your favourite memory?

Y. A.: I'd say a real highlight is the start of every race in the stadium: the silence, the countdown then the roar of the crowd when the athletes set off. My favourite memory will always be Sophie Chauveau coming 4th at her first ever World Cup event in 2022. She was just pipped to the post. It was incredible to be there for it on the finish line! »


